Foundational Elements of Sociocracy



Sociocratic Values (ethics)

Equivalence – individuals function as peers in deciding how to accomplish their collective aims

Effectiveness – designing for action; continuous development towards accomplishing aims

Transparency – direct access to all policy documents and records relevant to governance and decision making

Sociocratic Principles

Consent — Consent governs decision-making. Consent means there are no argued and paramount objections to a proposed policy decision.

Circles – circles are semi-autonomous, self-organizing units with their own domain and aim and their own action, development and feedback processes.

Double Linking – between circles - enables information (feedback) to travel up, down and across an organization

Elections – Circles elect people to functions, tasks and roles by consent and with transparency

Vision Mission Aim (VMA)

Vision – a description of the world as we want it to be in the future (*A world where...*)

Mission – our general approach to creating that desired future

Aim(s) – specific steps that carry out our mission and create our desired future (*To produce*...)

Election parameters

Responsibilities - *of* the position, role, task.

Qualifications -for the position, role, task.

Term – *how long* before end of or review of the position, role, task.

Election process outline

- Review & consent to parameters for role: responsibilities, qualifications, term
- Submit nominations to facilitator
- Round reasons for nominations
- Round invite changes to nominations, with reasons
- Facilitator proposes a candidate whose reasons for nomination satisfy parameters for role
- Round consent re proposed candidate (candidate last)
