WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower gravely told France late yesterday the United States will reappraise its basic European policies unless the proposed European Defense Community, providing for German rearmament, is set up soon. The President expressed this view as the third move in an extraordinary campaign directed by Secretary of State Dulles to carry the EDC issue directly to the French people and win their support of it.

Identify Buried Man

PATCHOGUE (AP) — Authorities have identified a body found on Long Island as that of Joseph Golombek, missing Air Force sergeant and former college athlete. The victim, police say, had been beaten and possibly buried alive.

An anonymous letter saying a "friend" had been "accidentally fatally injured" in a hunting mishap, gave instructions which led searchers Tuesday to a shallow grave under a brush pile in a lonely area near Great South Bay.

Under the brush and about 18 inches below the earth was the body, face up, the mouth stuffed with leaves. A ring on the dead man's hand, a class ring from Elon College in North Carolina, bore the initials "J. G." and the date 1947. College records showed a Joseph Golombek graduated from the school that year and had been a star football player.

Pier Results Due Monday

NEW YORK (AP) — The national Labor Relations Board said today the outcome of a neck-and-neck longshore bargaining election would not be known until Monday, with final results hinging on disposition of 4,405 challenged ballots among 21,244 cast in the two-day balloting.

When the counting of unchallenged ballots ended shortly before 2 A. M., the NLRB said the independent International Longshoremen's Association (ILA) formed 1,492 votes ahead of the newly formed ILA-AFL. The actual total vote was 9,060 for the old union, 7,568 for the ILA-AFL, 95 for neither union, 116 void, and 4,405 in dispute.

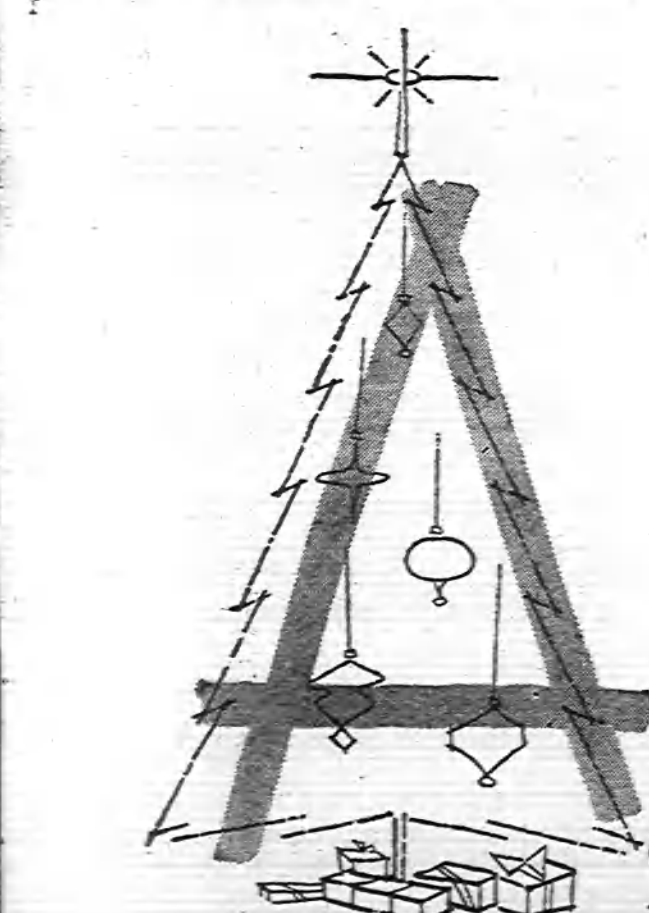
